



OUR MUNICIPALITY INTRODUCING THE TAX ON WASTE SACKS

1st January 2013

Under the terms of federal and cantonal legislation, and new local regulations on waste management, the costs of removing waste will be met by the producers of the waste.

FOR YOU, THIS MEANS THAT:

- From **1st January**, only **official, tax-paid white and green sacks** will be accepted for household rubbish.
- Use of grey, black or clear sacks will no longer be allowed.
- Penalties will be applied to those trying to cheat the system.

You will be able to purchase the sacks at your usual shops from **10 December** at a **price of:**

17 litres	•	roll of 10 sacs	•	Fr. 10.-
35 litres	•	roll of 10 sacs	•	Fr. 20.-
60 litres	•	roll of 10 sacs	•	Fr. 38.-
110 litres	•	roll of 5 sacs	•	Fr. 30.-

TAXED SACKS, PLUS AN EXTRA TAX, WHY?

Our Municipality has decided to apply the principle of 'polluter pays': the person producing the waste pays for its removal.

Shortly, new colours will be introduced for rubbish sacks. It will be **compulsory to use these sacks**, which will be identical throughout the region. They will be on sale in numerous shops, and at post offices.

The price of a sack will not cover all the costs. An additional tax will be used to cover removal of materials such as glass, paper, etc., the sorting centre site itself, and so on. The local authority will issue you with a bill each year for this. The tax may vary over time. The amount concerned is also linked to your commitment, and to the general effort made locally to manage waste.

Orders have been given for support and advice to be available, especially to families. Your local council offices can keep you informed.
